



THREAD THE NEEDLE

More about the care and laundering of petticoats: It isn't necessary or desirable to wash a petticoat after each wearing. You can wash just the waistband if you want. When you do decide to wash the whole petticoat, put it in the machine on gentle cycle with cold water and a cold-water soap. Agitate for only about 5 minutes, take it out, spin the water out of the machine and then put it back in the machine to rinse. Take it out before the spin, dripping, and spread it in a circle on a sheet or over a large golf umbrella to dry. Do not hang it to dry. After the excess moisture is gone, you can put a "crystal" petticoat in the dryer with **NO HEAT** just long enough to fluff it up and dry the nylon--then put it back on the umbrella to dry the top. Remember, no fabric softener!

White nylon petticoats get grungy or yellowed. RIT Color Remover or White RIT dye will often brighten them up. If not, think about dyeing it...you wanted a red petticoat anyway didn't you?

If "full and Fluffy" just isn't your thing, take a look at the nylon chiffon or soft nylon organdy slips that are available. These come in all lengths and can be worn under the longer prairie skirts. But don't forget, square dance petticoats are made to be seen, whether it is yards and yards of ruffles or just a hint of lace!

MIKE CONNING

Mike and Brenda Conning reside in Monroeton, PA. He has been calling for 17 years and has a beginners class, two clubs, and has run an Advanced workshop. He has been guest caller for several clubs in many states.

After two years of dancing with the Penny Promenaders in Athens PA, Mike was encouraged to try calling, since he has a college education in the music field. In 1976 he began his calling career by organizing and teaching his first class, which became the Grand Paraders Square Dance Club of Troy PA. In September of 1980, Mike took over the calling duties for the Shufflin' Shoes Square Dance Club of Binghamton NY.

He is a member of Callerlab and attended the 1992 Callerlab Convention in Virginia Beach. He is a full time music instructor for the Northeast Bradford School District in Rone PA, where he teaches both vocal and instrumental music in the elementary grades.

Mike has found calling to be a very rewarding experience, and appreciates the opportunity to call at festivals and clubs in New York State.

DON COY

Don started square dance lessons in 1972 in his home town of Louisville KY through the urging of a friend. In 1974 he attended caller classes, and in 1975 he helped form the first club he ever called for--the Motivators--who are still going strong. Before leaving Kentucky, he was calling for five local groups, including a singles club called The Southside Singles.

Don did a lot of traveling and calling in the Midwest. He has called at eight national conventions and many festivals. He has recorded for Red Boot Records and his latest release "Top of the World" was on the best seller list last year.

He makes his home in Brooklyn NY, and has a very busy program there, calling and teaching at least five nights a week and is also busy with his travel program.

Don has been entertaining people since he was twelve years old, singing and playing his guitar for anyone who would listen. He looks forward to seeing you in May at Dance-O-Rama.



BANNER STEALING RULES

Clubs wishing to participate in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and must have at least one miniature Traveling Banner that will be used for stealing.

In order to steal a member club's banner, the Stealing (visiting) Club must have at least four couples (one square) who have paid the Visitor's fee at the host club. A representative of the Stealing Club must then make it known to the president of the Host Club that they are attending the dance for the purpose of stealing the Host Club's Banner.

In the event that more than one club is attending for the purpose of stealing the Host Club's only available banner, it will be the duty of the President of the Host Club to determine some fair way to choose which of the Stealing Clubs will be awarded the banner.

Once a club's banner has been stolen, that club may retrieve said banner by sending no less than four couples to the Stealing Club's dance and then they can take their banner back home. If the retrieving club also wishes to steal the banner of their host, they must then have a second four couples in order to be eligible. Couples must pay the regular guest fee.

At no time can a member club allow another club to take a banner belonging to a third club. Also, when a club steals a banner from a club, it is the receiving club's duty to safeguard the banner they have stolen at all times. If the banner has not been retrieved by the owning club within a reasonable period of time (three months excluding June, July & August) the stealing club will be allowed to have at least four couples (max. eight couples not necessarily the stealing couples) return the banner as special FREE guests of the owning club. The president of the owning club must be given at least one week prior notice. (Impending plans to retrieve banner made known at that time will have priority over plans to return banner.)

Banner stealing shall be restricted to regular club dances only, and does not include any special dances a club might hold and so designate. In addition to those dances so designated, any dance which has a caller other than the regular club caller shall be a special dance. If a club does not have a regular caller, all dances shall be regular club dances unless so designated.





ACROSS THE MILES

This is the second part of the article that started in the last issue. It tells of the dancer-run and caller-run clubs we have joined.

DIXIE TWIRLERS

The dancer-run club we joined is the Dixie Twirlers. The club dances on the second and fourth Saturdays of each month and consists of 19 couples and 11 singles. They are a very socially orientated club, and do each dance up right! Each dance has a theme, that is reflected in their dress and refreshments. (No matter what we wear, I always feel under dressed.) It is evident that they go to a lot of effort to dress in the most outstanding square dance costume possible, with hair all done up and fingernails polished. Every member brings a dish, for refreshments, too each dance. Many are main dishes (casseroles, hot pots, etc.) and many desserts. With such a large spread, it's necessary to "break for refreshments" with guests invited to go first.



This club has a meeting the first Tuesday of each month, at a library. All members are expected to attend, and most do. The officers are elected for a six-month term. Committees are established from the remaining membership, and usually continue in that capacity through many terms.

One very important committee is the telephone committee. The head of this committee, Josephine, has it very well organized, and soon asked me to be on it. Whenever there is a visitation, or a meeting, (at least once a month) she calls her committee with the details. We, in turn, call those assigned to us. This is a very efficient way to keep contact, and seems to keep the whole club closer. She also calls members that miss a dance just to make sure everything is o.k.

One couple is in charge of visitation. They arrange visits to other clubs at least once, but most often twice a month. Normally the club costume is worn. This couple also arranges combination dances, (normally with another club dancing on the same night) about twice a year.

Other committees that I know of are: social, hospitality, supplies, decorations, caller-cuer liaison, representatives to MASDA (Metro Atlanta Square Dancer Association) and GSDA (Georgia State Dancer Association), and reporter to newspaper.

The financial aspect of the club is very similar to your area. Dues are \$30 for 3 months or \$5.00 at the door. We dance at a community center, and the cost is \$20 each dance. The caller, Danny Weeks, is paid \$85 a dance, the cuer, Robbie Robertson, is paid \$50 a dance. (Both the caller and cuer are of above average caliber, so these costs may be a little higher than the average.)

Classes are on each Thursday evening (different evening), at a church hall (different location), with the same caller as instructor. Classes may begin any time of the year. Alas, the class members are then encouraged to join a plus workshop. (We met one very enthusiastic and likable couple, while they were struggling with the plus workshop. They are no longer with us as it was too much for them too fast.)



ROAD RUNNERS

The caller run club that we joined is the Road Runners. They dance Plus on the first and third Mondays of each month. They are a much less formal club, in fact, it is casual dress attire if you want, and most do. This club does not have refreshments as a rule, (except for coffee) and no formal meetings. The caller's wife, Tick, always looks very neat, and greets all at the door. Jack Crane, is the caller, a very regular guy, that has a very good rapport with all his dancers.



A very enjoyable part of this club, is the after-dance party. All are invited to go to a local restaurant after the dance for a bite to eat. The conversation is lively and congenial. You get to know and enjoy each individual better in this setting. Tick and Jack, always fun to be with, listen very carefully to the interesting discussions for any comments or suggestions concerning the club.

The dues for this club are \$10.00 a month, or \$6.00 at the door. There are usually four to twelve squares, many of which are visitors.

Next issue I'll tell you about the area organization, publication, and some personal observations.



CHEF'S CORNER

During the month of March we celebrate St. Patrick's Day. In honor of all the truly Irish and the "wannabe" Irish, here's a little bit of the "Auld Sod."

Potato Onion Soup, Irish Style

4 Tbs. butter
2 med. yellow onions, sliced
2 lb. potatoes, peeled & sliced
3 cups milk
5-1/2 cups chicken stock
1/4 cup chopped fresh chives
1/2 tsp. celery seeds
1/4 tsp. dried thyme
1 cup light cream
Salt & fresh ground pepper to taste
ROUX - 2 Tbs. butter, 2 Tbs. flour

Heat a 6 to 8 qt. stockpot, add butter and onion, cook gently. Do not let the onion brown. Add the potatoes, milk, stock & herbs. Cover, cook gently for about 1 hr. Prepare a roux: melt butter in small saucepan and whisk in the flour. Let the roux bubble for 2 mins. on med-low heat, stirring constantly. Thicken the soup with the roux, whisking carefully to avoid lumps. Cook for about 5 mins., then puree the soup in a processor blender. Add the cream and reheat, but do not boil. Season with salt & pepper to taste. Serve with chopped fresh chives and chopped crisp bacon as garnish. Serves 8 to 10.

NOTE: In place of the bacon you may use cooked chopped prawns or cooked diced lobster as garnishes. Enjoy!
