### KEOKUK SWING-EZY REPORT

The Swing-Ezy Foundation, established to handle  
the donations and affairs of the victims of the  
terrible explosion in Keokuk, Iowa has recently  
issued a report of the situation six months  
after the catastrophe.

Total contributions to the disaster fund exceed  
\$220,000.00 and current contributions have re-  
duced to a mere two to three pieces a week.

The fund Trustees have authorized expenditures  
in excess of \$41,900.00 and will continue to  
meet expenses for the injured as long as is  
necessary. The money has paid doctor and hos-  
pital expenses above insurance benefits, travel  
expenses by specialists to Keokuk, special nur-  
se expenses, living expenses for those unable  
to work and aid to orphaned children.

In some of the cases, continued care and cor-  
rective surgery will continue for as long as two  
years.

Contributions were received from all over the  
world--Australia, Canada, Hawaii, Germany,  
France Puerto Rico, Phillipines, New South  
Wales and from every state in the Union.

One indeed gets a feeling of warmth knowing that  
contributions from various local clubs and pri-  
vate groups plus the Dance-O-Rama donation have
