



Russell and Jennie Farage have moved to Webster. The club wishes them success and happy dancing in their new location.







THIS SUBERS EXERCISE CAN DOES BUILD SELF-CONFIDENCE BY DEVELOPING INDIVIDUALITY THROUGH CREATIVE HAPPY MOVEMENT. SQUARE DANGING HELPS TO GIVE PEOPLE A SENSE OF BELONGING AND PERSONAL WORTH, PLUS AN AWARENESS FOR LEARNING CONSIDERATION OF OTHERS AND ACCEPTING RESPONSIBILITY IN A GROUP SITUATION.

LEARNING TO DANCE TOGETHER ALSO HELPS GIVE PEOPLE A FEELING OF UNITY, ESPECIALLY WHEN OVERCOMING SHYNESS AND CLUMSY MOMENTS. FURROWED BROWS EVENTUALLY MELT INTO SMILING FACES. STIFF AND UNBENDING FOLKS WILL RELAX AND "LET THEIR HAIR DOWN," AND FALL INTO THE SWING OF A RIP-SNORTING GOOD TIME. MANY A PERSON HAS SAID, "I'VE ALWAYS WANTED TO DANCE, BUT I FEEL SO SON!"


