Contra Corner



Contra dancers do it in lines! There's nothing mysterious about contras; the basic movements are the same as those in square dancing: right and left through, ladies chain, square through, star through, pass through--all familiar to square dancers. The differences lie not so much in what you do, but in how you do it and with who (whom?).

In squares you're concentrating on hearing (and hopefully understanding) the next call; in contra dancing you know what's coming after the first time through since the sequence repeats (like a singing call) and you can relax and enjoy moving to the music.

In squares you hear and react to the $\underline{\text{beat}}$ of the music only; in contras you hear and pace yourself with the $\underline{\text{phrase}}$ of the music (like a round dance) and a ladies chain seems to "fit just right".

In squares you dance with three other couples; in contras it may be 10 or more. You do the same things with different people rather than different things with the same people.

One thing that is the same is variation of difficulty. Contras can be very simple or very difficult (basic or challenge) just as squares can. The challenge in squares however is memorizing long lists of commands (head work) and reacting to them instantly; in contras its moving smoothly and accurately through a complex pattern (body work).

Are contras better than squares? Not necessarily, it all depends on why you dance, or at least on why you dance at a given time. Contras are however a different way to dance and an important part of the traditional square dance picture. One warning, however: because the feel is so different from squares they don't always mix well in the same program. Try them for an evening sometime mixed with traditional rather than modern squares.

Will you like them? You'll never know 'till you try, will you?

XPERIMENTAL WORKSHOP CALL OF THE MONTH

SLIP CHAIN THRU

From two parallel right-handed waves, the centers turn half by the left, then cast right 3/4 to temporarily form new waves at right angles to the first one. The new centers turn half by the left, then cast right 3/4 again to end in parallel right-handed waves.

from box 1-4:
step to a wave
SLIP CHAIN THRU
swing thru
boys run, calif. twirl
square thru 4
trade by, ALLEMANDE

EXAMPLES:

from 1-P,2P lines:

pass the ocean
SLIP CHAIN THRU
centers trade
boys run, calif. twirl
star thru, square thru 3/4
ALLEMANDE

CHAZUMO DAZU-ZE DAZUE

CHALLENGE DANCING
IN THE ROCHESTER AREA

Rochester has two challenge clubs and several 'tape groups' workshopping at the various challenge levels; viz: The Rollaways, the older of the two clubs has been dancing at the challenge level for twenty years and is perhaps the oldest challenge club in the country. They dance at the C-1 level (basic challenge) which comprises about 60 calls beyond the Advanced level. A variety of national and local challenge callers is scheduled by the board of directors for their twice monthly dances. The King of Hearts, the younger of the two clubs, is three years old and dances at the $C-l\frac{1}{2}$ to C-2 level (extended challenge) --- on alternate weeks to the . Rollaways---a beneficial arrangement since many local challenge dancers hold membership in both clubs. Nationally known challenge caller Ross Howell is the founder and caller for the King of Hearts. Ross is considered the leading advanced/challenge caller in this area and is known nationally for his talents as a challenge caller.

Besides these opportunities to dance weekly with either the Rollaways or the King of Hearts, area challenge dancers participate in basement groups which offer a regular opportunity to maintain and increase their skill at this high level of dancing. This is an ongoing commitment which is typical of the challenge dancer elsewhere for, to quote Ed Foote, "to become and maintain the capability of being a challenge dancer is not an easy task. A challenge dancer must dance at least once a week, and many dance twice a week, with a caller who will continually offer variety in his choreography. Challenge is a wide variety of calls (300 to 400) put together in interesting and stimulating sequences of smooth choreography so that the dancer must listen intently, understand, and respond immediately to the calls. The dancer should thoroughly understand the definition of a call and be able to execute it with precision and with little or no hesitation from any position, even if he has never hear the call used in that particular position before."

With perhaps only about ten percent of all active square dancers going on into challenge dancing, the total number in this level of square dancing is relatively small. However, the individuals concerned are large in enthusiasm, skill and commitment and their numbers are growing at a slow and steady pace, as is square dancing in general.
