



For the third quarter of 1978, the CALLERLAB Quarterly Selection Committee has voted ONE new movement to be used for MAINSTREAM Workshopping.

The movement is: STROLL & CYCLE
STROLL & CYCLE (Carl Wamsley, Picayune, Mississippi)

From a two-faced line between couples facing in: From normal positioning-the Center Girls in the two-faced line

Trade while the four Boys step ahead. The Boys stepping to the Girls on the Outside perform a RECYCLE and veer slightly left to face in as a couple. The Boys stepping to the center of the set join the Girls who traded to form a momentary two-faced line and then step ahead as a couple. The movement ends in parallel two-faced lines.

ALLEMANDE LEFT...







Contra Corner

Ed Butenhof

were featured and enjoyed by many at the National Convention in Oklahoma City. There were two halls going simultaneously most of the time and a biginners contra clinic by Don Armstrong (who called for us in Rochester last fall) drew over 4,000 dancers.

Contra can be ruined if the caller does not keep everyone dancing on the phrase, but in the hands of those who really know contras, the dancing is on the phrase with the music and great!

What do I mean by phrasing? Listen to a singing call carefully and you'll find that the music consists of groups of eight counts (steps). (Hoedowns have the same phrasing, but in many of them the phrasing is very subdued and hard to distinguish.) Those eight counts constitute a phrase. In contras (or quadrilles), the dancers start every movement on count one and finish on count eight. Occasionally two four count movements back to back make up the eight. In every case, however, the music is the important controlling factor, not the caller. Experienced contra dancers will ignore the caller if he gets "off phrase" and will continue dancing with the phrase, as they should.

Contras are part of square dancing - both historically and presently. If you haven't gotten acquainted with them perhaps you should. No new basics to learn, just a new style and a new feeling for the music.






