



What an interesting and soul-satisfying hobby! Aren't we lucky to be Western round and square dancers? You bet we are! Keep dancing and you'll keep interested and caring and most fortunately, keep enjoying! It's great to be a dancer.

#### SPECIAL EVENTS

#### NEW CRITERIA

At the January 12 meeting of the Federation, the following recommendations for the Special Events Calendar were accepted:

1. Each listing for each special event should be submitted to the Editor of the **Promenader**, who shall be the new Keeper of the Calendar since it is more feasible that the information be sent to one central place.

2. A nominal fee of \$5.00 shall accompany each Special Event listing based on the assumption that if one couple attends the special dance the listing has served its number.

3. The listing may include club/class dances (to be so indicated). The \$5.00 fee will be a one-time charge for each event until the date of the event has elapsed.

4. The Special Event should contain the date of the Special Event, the sponsor of the event, and/or name of the caller.

5. The Special Event shall be listed in each issue of the **Promenader** including the month of the scheduled event.

6. This new policy will commence with the April 1987 Issue of the Promenader. For printing in the April Issue, the Information and check must reach the Editor no later than March 3, 1987

7. The sponsors of Special Events currently listed in the **Promenader** will be contacted by the Federation explaining the new criteria for Special Events.

#### THE MAILBOX

Dear Editor,

Recently I re-read September's article concerning creating an ideal club atmosphere. I have a suggestion for one way to literally improve the atmosphere at

square dances: Limit Smoking.

Although there are only a few smokers at the clubs we regularly attend, it only takes a few smokers to foul the air. We unfortunately run into a lot of pipes and clgars and find the smoke from these particularly bothersome. I am dismayed at the thoughtless behavior of these smokers who fill their needs regardless of the discomfort it may cause others. No one has ever asked me if I minded!

Perhaps the worst offender is the CURE dance. I am amazed that a dance to raise money for a cancer support group would not protect non-smokers. The one room where snacks are available has been so smoke filled that I could barely see across the room, let alone breathe.

Considering the probable upcoming state-wide restrictions on smoking, square dance clubs may be wise to develop a few rules of their own.

Some suggestions are:

1. Under no circumstances should smoking be permitted in the dance hall, either before or after the dance or between tips; by dancers, observers, or club workers.

- 2. An area should be designated where smokers can indulge. This area should be separate from the snack table. Nor should this area be the Ladies Restroom!
- Special events (such as club dinners) should reserve some smoke-free tables.
- 4. Large dances ( such as CURE, Dance-O-Rama, and hopefully E.S.S.A.R.D.F.) should provide a smoke-free lounge where dancers can relax, chat, and have a cup of coffee without being subjected to second-hand smoke.

Cigars and pipes should be left in the car!

6. Smokers should remember that we are delighted to have them dance with us. However, many of us are bothered very much by your smoke. Please abide by restrictions and be considerate of the health of others.

From the suggestions in September's article, the keys to having a good club seem to be communication and consideration. With these keys, smokers and non-smokers should be able to continue to work together for an ideal club atmosphere.

#### NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE ORGANIZATIONS

Last month the **Promenader** carried information on local square dance organizations. This month we'll highlight some National Organizations.

CALLERLAB, the International Association of Square Dance Callers, is an organization of callers, to promote, promulgate and improve square dancing in all its forms. It provides leadership and direction for the calling profession. This organization is responsible for establishing the Basic, Mainstream, Advanced, and Challenge Programs. It has established a Code of Ethics for callers, an accreditation system for callers, and caller's school curriculum. Many of our Rochester callers are members of this organization.

LEGACY is a leadership, communication, resource center, attempting to establish a public trust for the continued development of square dancing. Legacy represents Square and Round dancers, Organizations, publications, record companies, and suppliers. It has drawn up the Leadership Manual - a must for persons in square dance offices and leadership roles. Legacy conducts the biennial Legacy Survey, which provides insights into the strengths and weaknesses of square dancing. We have many Legacy members in the Rochester Area.

UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA, created in June 1981, represents the square dancer through state and regional dancer organizations such as Rochester Area Federation. As a united voice U.S.D.A. is able to express the view of the dancer on a national level. Some current U.S.D.A. programs are:

- 1. Dancer Accident and group liability insurance,
- 2. Forum for encouraging the benefits of dancer-leader interaction,  $% \left( 1\right) =\left( 1\right) \left( 1\right)$ 
  - 3. Active programs for Handicapable Dancers,
- 4. Square dance museum and Hall of Fame to recognize dancer contributions,  $% \left( \frac{1}{2}\right) =\frac{1}{2}\left( \frac{1}{2}\right) +\frac{1}{2}\left( \frac{1}{2}\right) +$
- 5. Assistance for groups desiring organization for betterment of square dancing.

This organization meets twice a year; at the national convention and in January. Rochester hosted this meeting for the first time in January this year. This meeting was organized by the Rochester Area Federation Representative at Large, Orlo Hoadley. (See report of the meeting this issue.)

ROUNDALAB is a professional Round Dance teachers' organization, to promote, protect, and perpetuate the general round dance movement. It developed a Code of Ethics and Dress for round dancers. It is standardizing definitions, and developing procedures for accreditation of teacher-training schools.

These are some of the more prominent national organizations. The officers and members of these organizations put forth a lot of energy, time, and money to support the successful continuation of square dancing. These organizations provide a framework for square dancing at the national level. Contact the **Promenader** if you desire addresses or further information concerning them.

steadily, that participation in the insurance program is also growing, especially in the West, and that efforts to get Congress to name the Square Dance as the National Folk Dance are being pursued with renewed vigor. Two documents were accepted by the Executive Board for presentation to the Board of Governors in June: one is a Code of Ethics and the other is Suggested Simplified Rules of Order for Square-Dance Organizations. If approved, they will be added to the information resources of the USDA and recommended to the attention of member groups.

#### WHAT IS THE USDA?

We are not talking about the U. S. Department of Agriculture, although we might think about grading dancers and callers as Prime, Choice, Good, Standard, and Utility. Nor is it any of these:

Urban Sprawl Deletion Advisors, Understanding Silliness and Doltish Antics, Useless and Slow Deliberations, Always, United Satire and Double-talk Association, Unicorns, Stags, and Dromedaries Assembled.

What the initials do stand for is the United Square Dancers of America. One of its founders, Charles Naddeo, is also the founder and president of the Square Dancers of America, which is the organization that put the squaredance float in the Rose Parade. He is currently the chairman of the Insurance Committee of the USDA, and its Parliamentarian.

The USDA was formed in California in 1982. It was formed by dancers, for dancers, and is under the control of dancers. It was intended to be a national organization of state-wide square-dance associations or federations, but the Bylaws have been amended to provide for affiliation by local-area federations of square-dance clubs, such as the Rochester Area Federation. All clubs and individual dancers belonging to an affiliated organization are considered to be members of the United Square Dancers of America.

The purposes of the USDA are to promote square dancing with its related forms of dancing, and to represent it to the public as a wholesome family type recreation; to provide communication and education among dancers and square-dance organizations; to encourage cooperation between member groups and all organizations involved in the promotion of square dancing. Activities of committees of the USDA include:

- ---A program to pursue the permanent designation of Square Dancing as the National Folk Dance of the USA;
- ---Attempting to obtain the publication of a Square Dance Commemorative Postage Stamp;
- ---Supporting the activities of persons and organizations who provide dancing for "Handicapable" dancers;
- ---Providing an educational program and educational materials for dancers and leaders;
- ---Providing USDA costumes, jackets, badges, banners, decals, bumper stickers, etc. to all dancers desiring them;
- ---Promoting regional dance conventions in the four regional areas of the USDA.
- ---One of the most popular and valued activities of the USDA is the provision of economical Accident and Group Liability Insurance to affiliated groups. Other groups can obtain coverage, but at a somewhat higher cost.

Voting powers of the USDA lie in the Board of Governors, which consists of the delegates designated by the member associations, and meets on Friday afternoon of the National Square-Dance Convention each year. The Executive Board consists of the President, Howard and Loraine Backus of Arkansas, the four regional Vice Presidents, the Secretary, and the Treasurer. The Executive Board meets three times a year:—the new Board, after elections at the Governors' meeting, meets on the next day, a midyear meeting is held in January, and the final meeting is the day before the National Convention starts.

The four regions are Eastern (from Virginia north), Central (including the deep South), Plains, and Western Region. Besides the RAF, the only affiliates in the Eastern Region are the Worcester (Mass) Area Coordinators Association and the Federation of Delaware Valley S/R Dancers. The RAF representatives to the USDA are Rita and Orlo Hoadley, and they are also the Vice President for the Eastern Region.

The midyear meeting of the Executive Board was held in Rochester this year, on January 23-4. Several local dancer/leaders attended the meeting on the 24th, including two from the Buffalo area. It was reported that participation in the Handicapable program is growing

Callerlab and convention dictates that these two words signify different items. The Mainstream Program is (or should be) a much different program than the Plus Program. Just as the Advanced 1 Program is much different than the Mainstream Program. When reporting the symbols for your dances, use either M (mainstream) OR P (plus). When you use both symbols, readers expect both programs to be presented. Also note: We always use the word "program". There are no "levels" in square dancing.
