CARMEN'S COLUMN

RAISE YOUR CLUB LEVEL

It's the second tip of the evening. Your square has just whipped flawlessly through relay the deucy followed by spin chain & exchange the gears. Then the caller said, "recycle, sweep one quarter, load the boat, allemand left!" Perfect! What a square! Not even a The next tip, the caller announced a MAINSTREAM tip. "A bummer," you think. "We're a high level club. Why fool around with this easy stuff?" You keep the same square. The caller starts out, "Head couples square thru, dos-a-dos to wave, all eight circulate." Suddenly your square is in confusion. You look around you. Most the other squares are broken down also. The caller regroups everyone and calls the same pattern again with the same results. Even after a walkthru, there is still a lot of uncertainty. "What's happening?" you think. "That was a BASIC call and we should all know them! Maybe the caller's trying to trick us."

This is not an isolated example, but is commonly seen on many dance floors with other calls such as spin chain thru and eight chain thru. Scoot back and slide thru give many dancers problems, too, and these are all mainstream calls. A while back I remember buttons being distributed saying, "MAINSTREAM DANCERS ARE AN ENDANGERED SPECIES". This is more true now than ever. Mainstream is supposed to have the connotation that most square dancers can execute these calls without need for a walkthru. That no longer seems to be true. Apparently there is a large block of calls on the MAINSTREAM and BASIC lists we don't know how to do. In our rush to PLUS we have overlooked something.

When I see squares breaking down trying to get through a mainstream tip, I certainly don't think the dancers are dumb. After all, don't they do well on the supposedly more complicated calls? Rather, I see this as a problem with the callers they dance to on a regular basis. The key to doing any call well is practice. If you don't hear a call often enough, you can't learn it well. Who has control of the program? Why, the caller, of course. If he doesn't use these calls, you won't get the practice dancing them.

Since we now have established there are many calls

that are in the "list" that we don't know well, here is an opportunity to increase our knowledge, hence, RAISE THE CLUB LEVEL. Just as your board of directors was insistent learning the PLUS calls and raising the club level, now is the time to be equally as insistent on learning the MAINSTREAM calls. Maybe we can be a little militant about it. Approach the caller and the club president and say, "If you don't raise the club level and teach us the mainstream calls, I'm going to join another club." Sound like you mean it and put a little fear in them. If you are competent in all the MAINSTREAM calls and you are in a square where people break down

on them, say with a little disdain in your voice, "You PLUS dancers should go to a workshop and learn how to dance.", or something clever like, "You can always tell new dancers. They know all the PLUS calls, but screw up the MAINSTREAM calls." This should get a laugh

From all the letters in recent issues of the PROMENADER, it seems that everybody agrees that square dancing, or any other volunteer activity for that matter, has to be Fun or it's not worthwhile doing. What a lot of people don't seem to want to recognize is that there are a lot of different types of fun, for instance:

m being amused and/or entertained;

ma attending plays or concerts, where one gets more than just an hour or two of distraction;

**Bulling it up," "letting one's hair down," in a

group of congenial people, sometimes assisted by alcohol;

m fishing;

m going on nature walks;

me developing and exercising a skill, either physical or mental or both;

m pulling the wings off flies;

may visiting the zoo or a museum; etc., etc. Actually, instead of "Whee-e-e!, ain't we got fun!" aren't we really thinking of something that might better be called "enjoyment," or perhaps "satisfaction" or "gratification"? And doesn't the above list show that different people have different ideas about what kinds of activities are "fun" for them?

The next question is, why should people find their fun in square dancing?... What special thing does square dancing have to offer, when such benefits as sociability, entertainment, and pleasant non-strenuous exercise can be found in many other types of group activities?

From all that is said and written, it seems that most everybody believes that there is only one kind of square dancer; which means that all dancers or dancercouples like the same things as the people they know the best: themselves. On the other hand, over twenty years ago two highly and widely respected callers, Dick Jones and Earl Johnston, were saying that there are two different kinds of square dancer, which they called the "hobby dancers" and the "recreational dancers."

In my opinion, separating dancers into only two kinds is an over-simplification. It seems to me that there are at least three different values that people find in square dancing:

me continuing to extend the number of calls that they can recognize and respond to appropriately---the main value of the "hobby" dancers;

w variety of the things that can be done with a limited list of calls; for instance, variety of ways that the calls are put together, "Dance By Definition," dancing in setups different from the normal four-couple square, and a number of other gimmicks;

me the experience of dancing, defined as rhythmical movement coordinated with the music and the movements of other dancers.

If we define only three different degrees of interest in each of these three sides of square dancing---little or none, moderate, or high interest---it follows that there are not just two but eight kinds of dancers, differing in the relative importance they place on these three factors.... Yes, I know that three times three equals nine, but I figure that anyone who has no interest in any one of the three sides of square dancing would not be coming to square dances at all.

The countrywide decline in square dancing I believe can be charged to the practice of clubs and callers of trying (like most modern American businesses) to maximize their short-term benefits by catering to the largest group of customers, and never mind what happens to the less numerous types. That means that they are almost all competing for the same kind of dancers and leaving no place for the other kinds. This applies especially to the newer dancers who would like be another kind if they could, but become early dropouts when they learn that there's no place at the inn for them.

SON OF PREVIOUS WINNER TAKES 1991 LEADERSHIP AWARD

Square dancers attending Dance-O-Rama '91 revisited 1978, as the Leadership Award was again presented to the Shaws. In 1978, George and Una Shaw were the second recipients of this prestigious award. This year the award was presented to Bruce and Shirley Shaw.

The Daphne-Norma Leadership Award was established in 1977, by John Fink and Frank Salvagio, in honor of their wives. This award, first presented to Chuck and Gerry Prister, is to show appreciation for extensive and sustained leadership in the square, round, or contra dancing community. The criteria include: the many facets of leadership in local, state and national organizations, involvement in dancing or calling, attitude, and being a positive force and a good influence in the world of square dancing.

The members of the selection committee (the three most recent recipients) were very proud to honor Bruce and Shirley Shaw with the presentation of the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award at Dance-O-Rama.

Bruce and Shirley both started dancing as teenagers, and Bruce began calling in 1964. Over the years, Bruce has been class instructor for the Irondequoit Squares, and club caller for Henrietta Friendship Squares, Swinging 8's, and Cloverleaf Squares. Currently he is teaching and calling for Tecumseh Squares. He has had many guest calling engagements throughout New York State.

Bruce and Shirley were major promoters and participants of the very successful Muscular Dystrophy Benefit dances that lasted for ten years from the early 1970's through the early 80's. Bruce has been one of the callers for the Irish Childrens' Benefit dance since its inception in 1985. He volunteers for many demonstrations and volunteered at the last minute to be substitute caller for the New York State Physical Education Association Conference, which was held in Rochester in 1989.

In 1983, Shirley almost single-handedly, while chairing the Federation Publicity Committee, organized, raised funds, and brought to fruit a square dance promotional television commercial. This project brought Federation Clubs together working for a common goal.

Bruce and Shirley have been members of Callers' Coop of Rochester since 1970, and Bruce was its moderator in 1986. In 1984, they chaired the Leadership Conference. Bruce has been a member of Callerlab since 1975.

By their example and their attitudes, this year's recipients have continually demonstrated over the years qualities of leadership that have kept square dancing active in this area. This is the first time this award has been presented to a son or daughter of a previous award recipient. Our activity has been twice blessed. We give them our warmest gratitude and heartiest congratulations.

In his free time he loves to golf, or fish and play football with his sons.



out of your friends. After all, what's so bad about reverse snobbery? I have heard of club executive boards telling the caller to use every PLUS call during the Why not also tell him to use every MAINSTREAM call during the evening. If he has forgotten how to call them, offer him a scholarship to beginners class so he can learn them.

All kidding aside, most callers try to be responsive to what dancers want. Within the caller's capability, you will get what you ask for. Why don't you hear more calls from the mainstream program? Because, like it or not, most people can learn only so much in a given amount of time. In a situation where new people are coming into the club annually, to absorb the PLUS vocabulary, something has to be sacrificed, and that is much of the mainstream program.

If you truly want to be considered a good PLUS dancer, you must also be able to dance all the programs preceding it at least from the standard positions. May I also remind you that MAINSTREAM dancing is not necessarily easy dancing.




