



# A View From the Square

To change, or not to change, that is the question. Whether 'tis nobler to remain in the same dance program, bored and unhappy, or to move to another program, where the choreography is slightly beyond your ability...Hamlet's quandry was certainly more serious, but many dancers do need guidance when they face the issue of switching programs. There is no magic formula to determine the time to move to the Plus or Advanced programs. Some couples are ready sooner than others, while some should probably never move.

There are many inappropriate reasons for moving to another square dance program. Your boredom problem might be solved by switching to another club at the same program. Dancing to only one caller, week after week, same 'ole music, same 'ole figures, can get pretty tiresome, depending on the caller. To quote from an article by Ken Ritucci in the Nov. 1992 issue of American Square Dance magazine, "Mainstream is boring because callers are boring. Mainstream is boring because callers are bored with calling the level. Because callers are lazy and don't want to do the work necessary to make it fun and interesting for the dancers. Mainstream is boring because dancers get bored with themselves and have to reach for the next level of excitement."

If you have made a thorough investigation of all the local clubs and callers in your program and still want more complex choreography, you might be ready to approach the next program. But don't leap into classes for a new program unless all the calls in your current program are almost second nature to you; otherwise, you will frustrate yourself and the dancers around you. It's not a matter of the number of months or years you have been dancing at your current program. One Idea may be to ask your current caller to watch you dance and to advise you on your readiness for another program.

Each one of the ten programs in square dancing today builds on all the calls in all the prior levels, requiring a cumulative knowledge base; you don't just drop one list of calls and go on to another. Before starting classes for a new program, it is advisable to watch dances from that level to get some flavor for the choreography and complexity. Another way to get a taste of a new dance program is to order a teach tape for that program. Audio and video are available and come in two- or four-couple varieties. Many couples learn a new program from a set of tapes and also take live lessons for that program to gain additional strength. It may also be helpful to order a book that shows a graphical representation of the calls in your new program, pictures that show the flow of each dancer during all parts of the new call.

One of the best indicators that you are ready to proceed to a new program is your ability to understand why your square breaks down at your current program and what could have been done to prevent the collapse: did a dancer forget part of the call? Did the caller give a wrong cue? Was the square in the wrong setup?

It is important that both partners, not just one, have a real desire to embark on a new program. Don't let other couples pull you ahead against your better judgement. Also loyalty to a particular club should not hold you back if you are dissatisfied. Don't change programs if you merely need to change clubs, and definitely don't drop out of square dancing altogether if simply changing clubs or programs will make you a more contented dancer. We don't want to lose anybody for any reason.

And now for the undercover story-pettipants and petticoats. You can sew pettipants yourself if you want to: Kwik Sew has two patterns for square dancers, #1481 and #1466. By the time you acquire the pattern, thread, fabric and 18 yds. of lace, it is almost cheaper to buy them ready-made. Kwik Sew #1481 is also a petticoat pattern but is only a 32 yarder and a soft style-hardly worth all the effort when there are so many sources for ready-made petticoats in beautiful colors and fabrics.

Petticoats are meant to show and not only complete an outfit but can add spark to a dress you have gotten tired of wearing. The petticoat should be the same length as your dress or 1/2 inch shorter. If your outfit has a gathered waistline, you should wear a petticoat with a short yoke. The very full ones, 70 or 80 yards are often used for round dance. If you dress has a gored or circle skirt with the flare beginning at the hip, get a petticoat with a longer yoke (about 4" or 5") and a 50 yarder gives a lovely look.

There is really no successful way to renew or restore a petticoat—they all go down in time, but there are some things you can do to prolong their life. First look for a petticoat labeled "crystal", "sparkle", or "twinkle". They are nylon but unlike nylon organdy, they are full without being stiff and will fluff out and outlive the organdy. Never hang a petticoat between wearings—put it in a big box or pillowcase and set it on a shelf.

CHEF'S CORNER by John Zierle

This is the first of a sometimes, once in a while, occasional, regular column. The recipes I'll share have all been tested in the famous, spotless kitchens of Chez Zierlain. After a couple of columns, if you have a special recipe to share with our square dance community, send it to the "Chef" c/o this publication. We'll try to include them in future columns. The first recipe is a tasty, nutritious European tidbit called:

SWISS SPAGHETTI

1 lb. ground beef

2 cups canned tomato

4 Tbsp. butter/margarine

1 medium chopped onion

1 medium chopped green pepper

1-1/2 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. pepper

3/4 lb. cubed swiss cheese

1 lb. cooked spaghetti

1/2 cup grated swiss cheese

In saucepan melt butter and saute onion and green pepper, about 5 min. Add beef and cook over high heat until brown. Add tomatoes, salt and pepper. Cover and simmer 1 hr. Add cubed cheese and cook 5 min. Add spaghetti and toss. Serve with grated cheese. Enjoy!!



Square dancing is an extraordinary activity! When a change of jobs required our moving to Atlanta, Georgia, we knew no one. Bob met a square dancer at work. Through that connection, we were able to start square dancing and make some friends.

It was difficult leaving our Rochester area square dance friends and square dancing as we knew it. We would like to share the southern square dance scene with each of you personally, but that will have to wait until you all come down

to visit. Meanwhile, I'll try to relate what we've learned about square dancing here, in a three part article. In no way am I suggesting that this is a better system - it isn't! The finer points are different, but not necessarily better.

The hospitality is strikingly different. When a square dancer greets another at a dance, the gentleman puts his arm around the lady from the side, says hello and other welcoming statements. The The gentlemen ( ladies do likewise. shake hands with a friendly greeting. It's a friendly, warm, greeting and encourages conversation. This hospitality greets each suare dancer at the door.

This format is repeated in each square before the tip begins. Each man goes around the square and greets each of the ladies in this fashion, and the ladies say "Hello." a northerner, this seems a little over done, but is the custom. Sure enough, it is repeated after the tip is completed. Each individual thanks each of the

other dancers, both male and female. Most clubs here dance twice a month, alternating mainstream and plus tips. Rounds

are cued between the tips. There are both caller-run clubs, and dancer-run We have joined one of each because we

like to dance more than twice a month. Next issue I'll tell you about each of these clubs.

The outfit made quite a hit with not only the Host Committee but many other dancers, so Shirley Eck entered it in the Festival '92 State Outfit Contest. She and Harold modeled it in the fashion show, and it was voted to be the Official State Outfit for the period 1992-1997.
