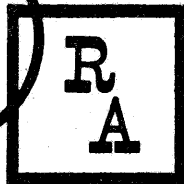

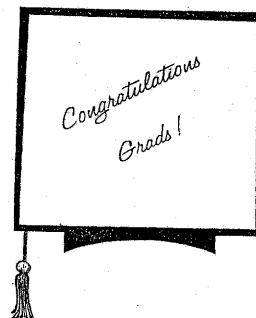

As long as you attend a club or dance that is listed for that level, you should have little trouble.

You may also have learned that most of the clubs in the area dance a program called Mainstream Plus. Most dancers find this the most enjoyable program, using a few more calls but still not requiring constant attendance and effort to keep up. There are workshop dances to help you get to that program, and we recommend you attend a series of these when you can.

If you are finding real difficulty with club dancing, many clubs that sponsor classes will be delighted to have you join their club and then attend the coming year's classes as "class angels." Many who have had trouble learning have done this and have become skilled and enthusiastic dancers.

But whatever you decide to do: **Don't quit. Hang in there! We need you!**

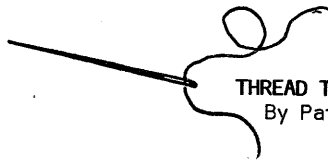

THREAD THE NEEDLE
 By Pat Flynt

Almost all square dance outfits have ruffles or flounces and learning how to gather these quickly and easily saves lots of time and aggravation.

This is the fastest, most fool-proof gathering method for the long strips used on square dance dresses. With a wide width, medium length zigzag, stitch over but not catching, heavy thread, like buttonhole twist. Secure one end and pull on the other to gather the edge--VIOLA--no more broken gathering threads! If this doesn't give you a fine enough gather, run another row next to the first.

The secret to evenly adjusted gathers is to always divide the skirt edge and the ruffle into quarters and mark these divisions clearly. On especially wide skirts or heavy fabrics, divide into eighths. Pin the edges together at the markings and pull up the gathering cords between the marks. You'll find it works better to do this on a table rather than holding it on your lap.

One of the problems of attaching a gathered edge to a straight edge is that with some fabrics, the gathers tend to bunch together and lump up during the sewing. To prevent this, after the gathers are adjusted and pinned, put a strip of masking tape below the stitching line, about 7/8" from the raw edge. Stitch with the gathered piece up.

Ruffler attachments and/or a gathering foot are available for your machine. These will create a ruffle and attach it to a flat piece of fabric in one step. To use them successfully takes practice and since each fabric gathers differently, you must always make a sample ruffle. If you use gathers a lot, it is worth learning to develop the "touch" you need for this attachment, but for an occasional outfit the zigzag and cord works best.

Does Anybody Care Anymore

Do Callers really care about dancers or do they just want to make as much money as they can, or prove what hot shots they are?

Do Dancers care about their clubs or are they more interested in doing their own thing instead of thinking of the welfare of their club?

A caller once said that We Callers should never forget that We were once dancers. We are hired to work for the club that books us, not as Broadway Stars with greatly inflated egos. We must do what the clubs tell us to do, not as we please, since they are paying us. This same Caller also said--"any caller can break a floor down but it takes a good caller to keep 85% of the floor dancing all the time". After all aren't the dancers paying to dance and not stand? DID THAT CALLER CARE ABOUT THE DANCERS? More and more callers are complaining because they had to join Callerlab now and that we have to be licensed. These are the callers that do their own thing, teach what they want when they want, instead of staying with the Callerlab list so that the students all over are doing the same thing. They teach old calls that have been dropped but are their favorite, or teach movements out of order like Teacup Chain (Mainstream Plus) the 1st or 2nd lesson. Do these callers care about the dancers?

That caller cared, he put the dancers ahead of his ego. You clubs can control the rest of us. If we don't give you 100% at each dance, don't hire us. The clubs have the control because if you don't book us, we can't call. WE WILL THEN HAVE TO START TO CARE OR SELL OUR EQUIPMENT.

If dancers cared about their clubs, more of you would attend your club sponsored dances no matter who was calling. I hear a lot by just listening. I hear dancers ask others if they are going to their next club dance & most will ask in return, Who is calling? Ask dancers to participate in a banner raid, what do they ask? Who is calling? Just ask a group of dancer friends to go to any dance and what's the question? - You got it - Who is calling?

Dancers don't go to a dance anymore, they go to a caller. Even if it is their own club, if the caller doesn't suit their taste, the heck with the club. Do these dancers care about their club?

I have heard the same story from many clubs all over, "We can only get 25 to 40% of our members to attend our club dances". They ask me why. Why is this happening? Does anybody care why? I can remember a time when dancers went to nearly all their club dances, just to have fun with all the members. Now stand back and look at your club, how many little groups do you see that stay together most of the time, and then go dance with someone else a tip or two and say "we did our duty, we mingled". Do these dancers care?

We are losing more and more dancers each year, especially new grads. Just think about the clubs, how many are in serious trouble, memberships are down, classes are down and if this keeps going, more clubs will fold. No one wants to take an office or become active in a committee. Are you becoming a dancing snob? DOES ANYBODY CARE? ANYBODY??? I DO!
