










April is upon us and it won't be long before the Vidalia onions will be in our supermarkets. Here is a delightful recipe using these wonderful sweet onions which are here for such a short

time. The recipe can be used as a side dish or double it for an entree. (Bake in 9" X 13" pan.)

VIDALIA ONION PIE

1 c crushed Ritz crackers - ½ stick of butter/margarine, softened - 2 c Vidalia onions sliced thin - 2 eggs - 2 T butter/margarine - 3/4 c milk - 3/4 t salt - 1 dash pepper (white preferred) - paprika - 1/4 c shredded cheddar cheese - parsley.

Mix cracker crumbs with softened butter. Press into 8" pie pan. Saute onions in the 2 tablespoons of butter until clear. DO NOT BROWN!! Beat eggs with milk, salt and pepper, and pour over onions. Sprinkle with cheese. Lightly sprinkle with paprika and parsley. Bake in 350f oven for 30 minutes or until knife dipped in center comes out clean. Serves 8.
