Chef's Corner...

The holidays are nearly upon us. This would be a good time to get ready for the gatherings accompanying the season.

Following is a different kind of appetizer gleaned from a celebrity recipe list. Sophia Loren explains this way: From the French we have learned many things. I also like to think this has been a reciprocal trade agreement. They gave us the love of mushrooms, and look what we have done with it.

SOPHIA LOREN'S STUFFED MUSHROOM CAPS

- 1 lb., large mushrooms, washed
- 1/2 cup bread crumbs
- 1/2 lb., raw shrimp, chopped
- 2 T green onions, chopped
- 3 T pimentos, chopped
- 3 T celery, minced
- 3 garlic cloves, finely minced
- 2 T parsley, chopped

Worcestershire sauce, salt & pepper to taste.



Wash and remove stems from mushrooms. Mix together bread crumbs, shrimp, onions, pimentos, celery, gartic, and parsley. Add salt, pepper, and Worcestershire sauce, (to taste). Place on foil in baking dish. Bake in preheated 325°F oven for 20 minutes.

FORUM FOR GROWTH OF THE SQUARE AND ROUND DANCE COMMUNITY

"Alone we can't win, together we can't lose."

On October 18, 1998, a group of concerned dancers and members of Callers Co-op of Rochester gathered at the Covenant United Methodist Church to discuss and seek some resolutions to the declining population of the square dance community.

Topics for the agenda included the need for a Publicity Committee in the Rochester Area Federation. At the present time, no one has come forward to spearhead this committee. The need for publicity and different ways to get our message out to the public were discussed and many good ideas ensued. Also included were things that "turn people off," such as square dance attire and commitment.

The main thrust is that we need to find a way to target new people, and a strategy planning committee of volunteers was formed. This committee, consisting of Federation officers, club officers, callers and other concerned dancers will meet again after the New Year.

The square dance community has much talent and resources represented in its ranks. We all know that square dancing is an activity which is good for our health and happiness. We need to share it with others. NOW is the time to think about how we can each do our part to ensure that five or ten years down the road, the activity that we love will still be there for us.

One very important thing that any square dancer can do is to attend meetings of the Federation, which are held monthly. The dates are listed well in advance in the *Promenader* (page 3). Make it a priority to find room in your busy schedules to participate. You don't have to be a club representative to come. All are welcome.

event and, of course, they went home with their banner. Now we are "fresh out" of other clubs' banners, so look for us to come "steal."



Dance at least twice this year to different callers at different clubs. Support my club all year. Plan to go to the next Federation meeting. Thank my partner for dancing with me. Keep at least three of these resolutions! Tell friends how much fun it is to square dance. Bring a new couple to our square dance lessons.

Tasmanian Adventure

Ask any traveling caller what he or she dislikes most about the job and most will say "the traveling." Sometimes the highway miles seem endless between the motels and the fast-food restaurants. Once in awhile, as you run through an airport hoping that you AND your luggage will make the next flight, you wonder if you really should have kept that 8-5 day job. But then a once-in-a lifetime experience will make you glad that you chose this occupation. Such was the experience I had when I was hired to call a square dance weekend in Tasmania.

Geography lesson # 1: Tasmania is an island off the southern coast of Australia. It is smallest state of Australia (about the size of Scotland) and has some 450,000 inhabitants. It also has about 150 square dancers.

My plane left Rochester, New York on a hot, muggy late June day for a short flight to Pittsburgh. From Pittsburgh there was a very crowded (every seat taken) 757 flight to Los Angeles. After a short layover, I boarded a Quantas 747 for a direct 14-hour non-stop flight to Sydney, Australia. In Sydney, I had a seven-hour layover before taking a flight to Melbourne and then, finally, a short flight to the city of Hobart, Tasmania. From the time I had left Rochester, it had taken me almost exactly 36 hours to get to Tasmania.

My flight touched down in Hobart in a cold, driving rainstorm where I was met by my hosts, Ron & Rose Berry.

Geography lesson # 2: June is a winter month in the southern hemisphere.

Ron is caller for the Eastside 8's Square Dance Club in Hobart. The club meets in Ron's own hall which he built from his garage. It will fit about six squares comfortably, although he told me he has had about 10 squares there on one special occasion. Rose is a tireless worker and organizer for square dancing in Tasmania. She is one of those behind-the-scenes type leaders who never takes credit for the huge amount of work she does. Without her, this weekend would have never happened. After a delicious lamb dinner and a visit from one of Ron's caller friends, I crashed, exhausted from my trip.

The next day Ron & Rose took me to Port Arthur where we saw the ruins of the prison where England sent convicts to in the 1800s and early 1900s. We stopped at a wildlife preserve where we saw kangaroos, wallabies and other native Australian wildlife. The day was topped off with a delicious seafood buffet at the Hotel Grand Chancellor in Hobart followed by a visit to "Joe's Bar" with its American '50s and '60s atmosphere, and finally to the casino in Hobart which is the oldest gambling casino in Australia. It was a great day!

The next day was Friday and it was time to decorate the hall and set up the sound. The dance was in a community center in Hobart which had no central heat, so Ron and I went into Hobart to rent a couple of large space heaters which hopefully would

take the 30-40 degree chill off. We met Rose and a few dancers and spent the next four to five hours decorating the hall. The theme of the dance was "Merry Ausmas," meaning "Christmas in Winter." By the time the dancers were done, you would have sworn that it was Christmastime with the huge Christmas tree in the back of the hall and Santa and his reindeer on the stage.

Friday night started the dance festivities. The program was for a Mainstream weekend, all sessions, and we ended up doing a couple of Plus tips ("brackets" as they are called in Tasmania). Each dance session was 3-1/2 hours long with NO breaks. I would call two or three brackets and then a local caller or two would call, then there might be a couple of rounds. Then I would be up there again. When I wasn't calling I was asked to dance. Tasmanians rarely dance with the same partner all evening. There are three or four "ladies choices" along with a "roundup" (Grand March) almost every other tip. The Mainstream level was solid and I workshopped things like "Half-Sashay Once-anda-Half" which they really enjoyed. The local callers were gracious, enthusiastic and always wanting to learn. The average size of the clubs in Tasmania are two to three squares. If you get four squares at your dance, it is a great success. The callers in Tasmania truly call for the love of the activity. The dancers especially like the singing calls. About 93 dancers attended the weekend. The age of the dancers was widespread, with many in their 40's and 50's. There were four dance sessions: Friday evening, Saturday afternoon, Saturday evening and Sunday afternoon.


On Sunday morning, Ron & Rose hosted a "callers' brunch" at their home. It was great to meet such a bunch of talented, dedicated guys and talk to them on an informal basis. They were especially interested in hearing me talk about dancing in the United States. They have the same problem of getting new dancers in Tasmania as we do, but when they do get a class, the new dancers are taught until they are proficient. There are no specific time periods for length of classes. Once dancers are "graduated" to Mainstream, they are encouraged not to go on to Plus for at least a year. There are few full Plus clubs in Tasmania.

The Sunday afternoon session was a dance/birthday party celebrating the 5th birthday of the Eastside 8's. At the end, I was presented with a beautiful clock made of wood with a small plaque on it commemorating the dance weekend. I was also given a bottle of Australian rum by one of the dancers!

The next morning I said goodbye to Ron & Rose. They were the type of people that even after only four days, I felt that I had known them for many years. I hope that they are able to visit our country someday so that I can return the wonderful hospitality that they gave me.

The Tasmanian experience will be one that I will never forget and is truly the highlight of my calling career.
