
Since then, we have gotten several additional contributions to our collection, and a variety of input.



CHEF'S CORNER...

I don't know about how you cope with the heat we've had recently. I've been searching through all my recipes to find ones that don't tie me down in a hot kitchen, supervising food cooking on a hot stove. The following is a super recipe for a cold or room temperature appetizer that is delightful to the gourmet in all of us. By the way it also is relatively fat free, 4.2 g per 1/4 cup serving, and it is cholesterol free!

HUMMUS BI TAHINI

- 2 (15 oz.) cans garbanzo beans, undrained
- 3 small cloves of garlic, or to taste
- 1/4 cup plus 1 tablespoon tahini (sesame seed paste)
- 1/4 cup fresh lemon juice
- 3 tablespoons water.



Drain garbanzo beans, reserving 1/4 cup liquid and set aside. Position knife blade in food processor bowl. Drop garlic through food chute with processor running, and process 3 seconds or until minced. Add garbanzo beans, reserved liquid, and remaining ingredients; process 3 minutes or until smooth. Spoon mixture into a serving bowl. Serve with pita bread wedges and raw vegetables. Yield approx 3 cups. (Serving size: 1/4 cup).



Have you ever been on a committee or board that was trying to decide on the date for a big dance? You probably want to plan your event on a date on which another club does not al-

ready have a big dance scheduled. Otherwise, you risk having less dancers available to attend yours.

Here is what you need to do:

1. As soon as you have an idea of when you might want to have the event, and **before you sign the con-**

tract with a national caller, or make any other commitments, check the Promenader Calendar of Events AND call the Master Calendar keeper (Ken Georger, 585-247-7259).

2. If the date is available on the Master Calendar, make your arrangements,

and notify the Master Calendar keeper that it is all set.

3. Send the information on your event to the *Promenader* for publication in the next issue on our **Calen-**

dar of Events. The charge is only \$5, and the listing stays in until it happens! And the sooner everyone in our square dancing community knows about your event, the better your chances of success! So make it a point to list the event as soon as the arrangements are complete. Forms available by mail/e-mail.

Protecting Your Investment

A new group of new dancers have recently graduated from many clubs. These new dancers are the clubs investments. The clubs have worked hard to make this small deposit into the square dancing organization. If you are reckless with your investment, you will receive little in the way of dividends, but with a little care you can realize a substantial return.

A bad investment decreases in value over the long term, a good one increases leading to a nest egg you can count on in the future.

#1 Encourage your students to get involved in some manner as an officer, chairperson, or a member of a committee.

#2 Make sure your new graduates feel welcome and a part of all club activities.

#3 Make sure they NEVER leave a dance feeling depressed or inadequate as a dancer. This could be a mistake you may never get a second chance to correct.

#4 Make sure to make square dancing a fun activity. If you see a square of recent graduates all squared together and they are having a hard time, get some of your club's accomplished dancers to ask 1 or 2 of the couples to square up with them next tip. This not only will make them feel like a part of the group, but you can help them through which will make them feel better about their dancing.

If your new graduates see that your club knows how to handle its investments wisely they will want to deposit the time and money they have invested with you and will be sure to tell their friends about the high yield returns they are enjoying. You can gain from the long term benefits of your class investments, but you have to do it the old fashioned way. You have to earn it.







We hope everyone had a good summer, and is looking forward to the new season. Welcome back to all, especially the new dancers.




Sept. 16 and 23 will be Open



Dancers: It sometimes happens that while dancing, a situation arises where someone collapses or faints, and it may be difficult for the caller to see what has occurred. IT IS IMPORTANT, therefore, that all dancers familiarize themselves with the square dance method of dealing with this kind of situation. This method is called E.C.M.A.



room.

STEP THREE: Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched cir-

cle.

STEP FOUR: On seeing this signal, the caller or club representative will immedi-

ately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.

E.C.M.A. is the abbreviation for Emergency Call for Medical Aid. This signal is designed for use by dancers to notify the caller of a medical problem in their square. When such a problem occurs, important minutes are often lost in the frenzy of waving arms and explanations which cannot be heard or understood across a crowded dance floor. The method of an ARCHED CIRCLE will assure the fastest possible response time by medical personnel to an emergency on the dance floor. In this way, precious, perhaps lifesaving minutes, can be saved.

STEP ONE: When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.

This system was, according to historical sources, first introduced at the 33rd National Square Dance Convention in Atlantic City, New Jersey, in 1977. It was their hope that callers across the country would take the time to explain the arched circle ECMA signal to their dancers and familiarize them with both the procedure and its purpose. This is not being done and we feel that this is an important part of our being prepared in the event of an emergency.

Clubs — please familiarize your callers, members, and guests with this procedure.
