CHEF'S CORNER...

Well here we are in the beginning of another dance season. Everyone is in the process of remembering which foot to start out with. This is also the time we are looking for something new for the snack tables. Here is a recipe I found while roaming the internet on the lookout for new and different recipes. This is a new twist on a favorite of mine, called:

SEASON'S BEST SPINACH DIP

1/4 cup butter or margarine

1 pkg. McCormick's Hollandaise sauce blend

3/4 cup milk

1 pkg. (10 oz.) frozen chopped spinach, thawed and drained 1 jar (4 oz.) diced pimentos, drained

1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese

1 teaspoon dill weed

1 cup sour cream

1) In a small saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Stir in the Hollandaise sauce blend. Gradually stir in milk. Cook, stirring constantly, until sauce comes to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer, stirring constantly, 1 minute, or until thickened.



2) Add spinach, pimentos, Parmesan cheese and dill. Heat, stirring frequently, until cheese is melted and sauce is well blended. Remove from heat. Add sour cream and stir until smooth.

Serving Suggestions: Serve dip in a decorative bowl and surround with crackers or in a hollowed-out round rye or pumpernickel bread loaf, cubing the removed inner bread..

If you have a recipe that has been especially enjoyed by a lot of folks, please feel free to share it with others on these pages. Here is one that Kay Georger shared with us:

KUCHEN

1/2 C shortening

1-1/2 C flour

1/2 cup sugar

1/2 tsp baking powder

1 egg

1/2 tsp salt

1/2 tsp almond

pie filling (peach, etc.)

Cream shortening and sugar; add egg and almond flavor. Blend. Mix in salt, flour, and baking powder, which have been mixed together. Mix well and spread 3/4 mixture in 8x8 pan or pie pan. Add pie filling 1/2 can or more to taste. Crumble remaining crust mixture over top. Bake at 350°F for 30 min. For 1 large kuchen, double recipe and use a 9x13 pan (and allow a little longer to bake).


your calendar for next year; we did. Hey, like we said: Fun Is Where You Find It!


famous-and-fakey "Amish" caller, **Jeff Bobst**, doing the squares, and Judy Doane exercising the other half of our brains, it was worth the trip.


Everett was a farmer until his retirement. He and Carolyn were married 62 years. He leaves three children, nine grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

Square Dance Vacation In the Mountains



CLUB OFFICERS... If you schedule a national caller or major event opposite another club's already planned major event, you both lose! Please follow these steps

when planning events:

Have you ever been on a committee or board that was trying to decide on the date for a big dance? You probably want to plan your event on a date on which another club does not already have a big dance scheduled. Otherwise, you risk having less dancers available to attend yours.

Here is what you need to do:

1. As soon as you have an idea of when you might want to have the event, and **before you**

sign the contract with a national caller, or make any other commitments, CALL THE MASTER CALENDAR CHAIRMAN (Ken Georger, 585-247-7259).

- 1. CHECK MASTER CALENDAR
- 2. COMPLETE ARRANGEMENTS
- 3. PUT IT ON THE PROMENADER CALENDAR OF EVENTS
- **2.** If the date is available on the Master Calendar, proceed to **MAKE YOUR ARRANGEMENTS**, and notify Ken immediately that it is all set.
- **3. SEND THE INFORMATION ON YOUR EVENT TO THE** *PROMENADER* for publication in the next issue on our **Calendar of Events**. The charge is only \$5, and the listing stays in until it happens! And the sooner everyone in our square dancing community knows about

your event, the better your chances of success! So make it a point to list the event as soon as the arrangements are complete. Forms available by mail/e-mail.

New dancers may rely on the angel couple to pull them through the squares or new move that is



being taught. That is not the angel's job. The angel is supposed to be in the right place at the right time. One might add, with a smile.

The angel's duties do not include teaching or correcting students. There is one and only one instructor. That is the caller. The caller should be the one to instruct the new dancers on the calls. The caller should be the one to do the correcting of the dancers having trouble. If a new class member in your square is having difficulty with a move, just ask the caller to go over it again.

Angels must always dance with a smile and give the class time to complete the new call. Remember...angels have the floor time and reaction time the new dancers do not.

Being an angel is like being a parent helping a child take its first steps. Angels are there to help them when they fall. Be kind and gentle and smile. And be there for them.

Dancers: It sometimes happens that while dancing, a situation arises where someone collapses or faints, and it may be difficult for the caller to see what has occurred. IT IS IMPORTANT, therefore, that all dancers familiarize themselves with the square dance method of dealing with this kind of situation. This method is called E.C.M.A.

E.C.M.A. is the abbreviation for Emergency Call for Medical Aid. This signal is designed for use by dancers

to notify the caller of a medical problem in their square. When such a problem occurs, important minutes are often lost in the frenzy of waving arms and explanations which cannot be heard or understood across a crowded dance floor. The method of an ARCHED CIRCLE will assure the fastest possible response time by medical personnel to an emergency on the dance floor. In this way, precious, perhaps lifesaving minutes, can be saved.

STEP ONE: When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.



Emergency Call for Medical Aid

STEP TWO: Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This allows the injured person and attendant air and room.

STEP THREE: Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.

STEP FOUR: On seeing this signal, the caller or club representative will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.

This system was, according to his-

torical sources, first introduced at the 33rd National Square Dance Convention in Atlantic City, New Jersey, in 1977. It was their hope that callers across the country would take the time to explain the arched circle ECMA signal to their dancers and familiarize them with both the procedure and its purpose. This is not being done and we feel that this is an important part of our being prepared in the event of an emergency.

Clubs — please familiarize your callers, members, and guests with this procedure.
