




Square dancing just can't get any better than this...and it always seems that the best dancers show up, intent on having fun.





In Memoriam - Pete Pardee

Pierre J. "Pete" Pardee, Age 77, of Pittsford, NY. Pete passed away in Rochester on Thursday evening, June 7, 2012 after an illness of about one month.

Pete was born in Youngstown, Ohio on March 4, 1935. He lived the early part of his life in Youngstown, and graduated from Boardman High School in 1953. He later attended Grove City College and graduated from Miami University of Ohio with a degree in Business Administration in 1965. In 1980 he graduated from Youngstown State University with a Masters in Counseling.

After graduating from Miami University, Pete joined the family firm, the James G. Pardee Company, where he served for many years as a salesman and, eventually, the president of the company. Upon retirement he moved to the Rochester area.

Pete leaves three children, Jim Pardee, of Rochester, the Reverend Martha (Edward) Carlson, of Mifflintown, PA, and Bob (Jamie) Pardee of Columbus, Ohio. He is also survived by grandchildren Sarah McLaughlin, Edward (Megan) Carlson, Shalon Pardee, Ross Pardee, Annika Pardee, and great-grandchild Alana McLaughlin, as

well as nephew James (Erin) Mokhiber and great-nephew Samuel Fallon-Mokhiber.

Pete's sister Patricia Helen Pardee preceded him in death. He is survived by his sister, Suzanne Pardee Mokhiber, of Pittsford, NY, with whom he made his home, and a brother, John Pardee, of Youngstown, Ohio. He is also survived by his special friend Pauline Novick, of Webster, NY.

Pete leaves many dear friends in the square dance clubs of which he was an active member over the years, attending dance conventions in many states and Canada. He was also a frequent visitor to Chautauqua Institution in Chautauqua, NY, where the family spent a lot of time vacationing over the years. Pete had a keen interest in electronics and in politics, and was always good for a lively debate.

Pete requested that memorial gifts be made to the Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs, Inc. 
When she told me that, I said: "Wow! I hope you remember, that's how great things get started, and make the


world a better place. Look at the fun we are all having, all because of you and your Dad. She had not met Ron before, so I introduced them, explaining to Ron her part in all of this.


